- Research Scholar Grants in Health Services, and Health Policy and Outcomes Research for Beginning and Senior Investigators Initial awards are made for up to four years and up to \$250,000 per year.
- Research Scholar Grants in Psychosocial and Behavioral Research for Beginning and Senior Investigators - Initial awards are made for up tofive years and up to \$500,000 per year.
- Postdoctoral Fellowships Awards are made for one to three years with progressive stipends of \$35,000, \$37,000, and \$40,000 per year, plus a \$2,000 per-year institutional allowance.
- Clinical Research Training Grants for Junior Faculty - Awards are made for up to three years for up to \$150,000 per year.
- Doctoral Degree Scholarships in Cancer Nursing -Awards are made for up to four years with a stipend of \$15,000 per year.
- Master's Degree Scholarships in Cancer Nursing -Awards are made for up to two years in the annual amount of \$10,000

Awards are made for up to four years with a stipend of \$15,000 per year. Application deadline: December 15.
- Postdoctoral Fellowships Support training of researchers who have received their doctorate to enable them to qualify for an independent career in cancer research (including basic, preclinical, clinical, psychosocial, behavioral, and epidemiologic research). Awards are made for one

to three years with progressive stipends of \$35,000, \$37,000, and \$40,000 per year and \$2,000 per-year institutional allowance. Application deadlines: March 1 and October 1.

- Clinical Research Training Grants for Junior Faculty Support training of junior faculty within the first four years of their independent faculty appointment to conduct mentored clinical, epidemiological, health services, health policy and outcomes, or psychosocial and behavioral research. Awards are made for up to three years for up to \$150,000 per year. Application deadlines: March 1 and October 1.
- Targeted Grants for Research Directed at Poor and

Underserved Populations - Support research projects that focus on poor or underserved populations and address a variety of behavioral, epidemiologic, policy, health care delivery, and clinical and basic science issues. Applications accepted for all of the above programs.
